"I know," said his Grandpa, "let's play a funny game."

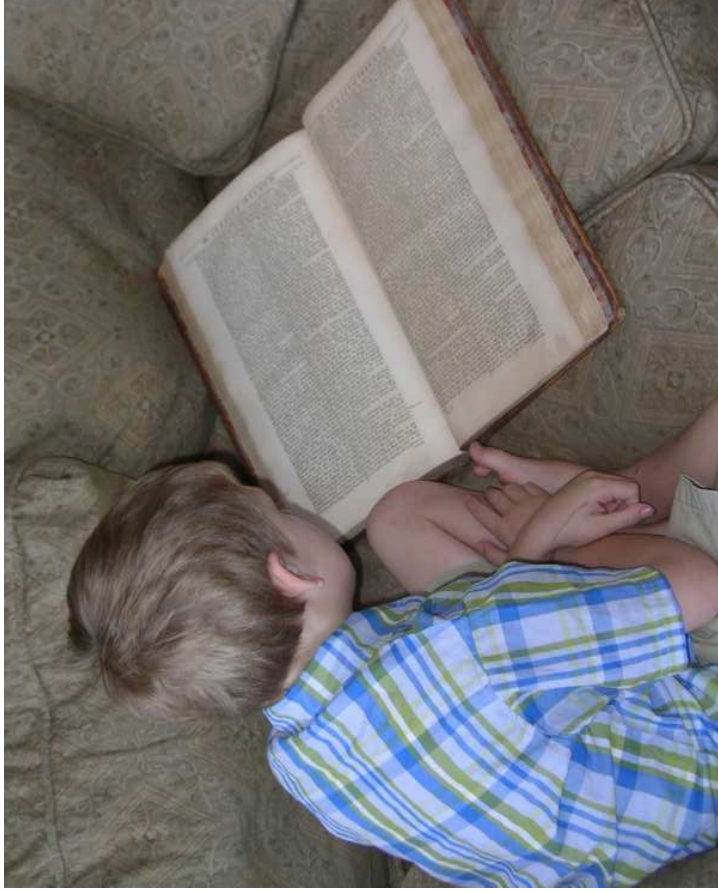
"I love games," said Connor.
